General context


- A need for all involved in the ICM process
 - 'captains and crews'
- ICZM 'professionals'
 - PO distinct requirements & issues
- International context
 - well-recognised
 - 40 short-courses / year; increasing no. of conferences & workshops etc.
 - developing world focus




NW European context

- ICZM development
 - EC Recommendation
 - Some Member States 10+ years of estuary/coastal management
 - ICZM 'professionals'/ other stakeholders
- Marine / ICZM & related policy developments
 - EC marine thematic strategy
 - New horizons & challenges
- Coastal issues / pressures
- Professional development
 - CPD formalisation
 - Nature of employment





ICM capacity-building: approaches & examples



ICM capacity-building approaches

Formal training

- external/internal (in-house e.g. UK agencies)
- in person/long-distance/virtual
- ad hoc & little provision in NWE
- short courses; distance learning;
- web-based

Semi-formal

- meetings & conferences
- 'brokering' / interpreting literature

Informal

- workshops
- networks / networking
- mentoring / job swaps



Example II contd.

- Approach
 - relates European principles & process to Wales
 - Welsh examples /What principles mean for Wales
- Format & style
 - simple jargon-free, bite-size text, illustrated
 - build on approach in LGA risk pack
- Preparation process
 - role of Chair enabling; literature
 - involvement of key stakeholders examples
 - lengthy process (mirroring ICZM process itself!)ownership, understanding & credibility
 - face-to-face meetings & email discussions
- Model for other partnerships e.g. NWCF

Challenges



Challenges for delivery

- Heterogeneity
 - o practitioners / employers
 - suitability for 'sceptical' professionals & casual users
 - o difficulty of engaging 'crew' in training
- Perception of ICM
 - Relatively intangible 'soft' topic / other 'technical' CPD
 - Non-statutory= non-essential, peripheral (in NWE)
- Long-term
 - stakeholder & decision-maker mobility
 - reorganisation major commitment (cause-effect)
- o Frequent issues (UK survey):
 - time / funding / employers support / short-term employment



Recommendations



ICM capacity-building requires

- Guidelines & support (at all levels)
- Multi-faceted packages
 - many tools & approaches
 - suit differing needs/time commitments/backgrounds
 - NO one-size fits all approach



- Local, cheap & appropriate (relevant) delivery
 - applied and not too academic; national v. regional
- LONG-term & throughout the ICM process
- Aspects of ICZM to be covered
 - 'subject' & 'conceptual' topics / ICZM process skills
 - other soft & project management skills (ICZM context)

requirements contd.

- Methods & styles of delivery
 - active / problem-based learning
 - use of case studies / simulation / fieldwork
- Design stage
 - comparison with other subject CPD
 - piloting / evaluation
 - involve key stakeholders
- Consider appropriateness of professional development ICZM providers
 - professional bodies / accreditation
 - role of HE / coastal networks
- No substitute from INVOLVEMENT and 'learning by doing'
